6. COMPETITION ORGANISERS' REPORTS

County Championship - No report.

The Division 4 meeting was held at Seckford Golf Club on Wednesday May 18th. A total of 57 competitors with handicaps from 31-36, drawn from 14 different clubs, competed for the Olive Carruthers Cup. As always this competition was played with great enthusiasm and good humour, though the spirits were dampened for early starters with a little drizzle. It soon brightened though and the ladies had a great day. Tees and greens at Seckford were in excellent condition and efficient ball-spotters were praised for their hard work in keeping track of balls following interesting fairway bounces on the parched ground. There was great teamwork amongst the club's members in the club-house too that ensured all went smoothly.

In the end Susan Whymark from Woodbridge GC was the worthy winner with a sparkling 43 points. Sheila Walter from Newton Green was in second place with 41 points closely followed by Coral George from Fynn Valley GC with Dorothy Flatman from Felixstowe Ferry GC gaining 4th place on count-back. In the team competition Woodbridge were pipped on count-back by the consistent team from Ipswich who regained the Shield that they had won 2 years ago.

This was done for Division 4 entries and some clubs were grateful for the prompt. Certainly Division 4 had a larger field than in recent years though a number of clubs were notably unrepresented.

The second match v Essex, was played on Monday 13th June, at Stowmarket G.C.

Once again, we were blessed with super weather, and apart from somehow or other, Essex ladies being given the wrong Tee time (they came for 11.00 a.m., instead of 12.00 noon), the day went really well. We were grateful to Alan Feltham, Secretary at Stowmarket, for “squeezing” us all off earlier at 11.30 am – which meant that Essex ladies did not have to wait too long.

Essex has a very large area to draw their team from, and had several ladies playing, who were of a very low handicap and still playing for their County. Also, Essex “seniors” side, starts at age 50, so there were a few quite “youngish” ladies – well in our eyes anyway.

Sadly we lost 3 matches to 1. Sue Cook being in the winning pair for Suffolk – who stated that on the day “she putted like God”. Well done Sue and Vivien Parker.

Junior Organisers Report – Kay Anderson

The Suffolk Junior County Championships were held at Aldeburgh GC on June 2nd. when 13 girls played in the Medal and 11 played on the River course. Sarah Howe won the Moss Blundell Trophy and the Daily Telegraph qualifier with a gross 81 and Melissa Schroeder won the Handicap Plate with a net 71. The Holly Trophy (Stableford) was not presented this year as all girls on the main course were eligible for the Medal competition. Conditions were good, and the course had benefited from the recent rain.

The Junior Matchplay for 2011 will be played on a home or away basis, with end dates for each round.

Suffolk Juniors again figured in the County Championship at Woodbridge in early May when Blaize Esmond defeated Sarah Howe in the Matchplay final. Blaize and Sarah will again be involved in County Week.

Junior County match against Herts. 1st. team was played at Mill Green GC, Welwyn Garden City on May 15th., resulting in a home win by 4½ - 1½. Suffolk were missing at least one key player, and the games were closer than the score might suggest. The 1st. and 2nd. teams played Bedfordshire at Bury St. Edmunds GC on June 12th; again key players were missing due to ACE final assessments, and other exam commitments, but the 1st. team managed an honourable draw despite one girl conceding through injury. The 2nd. team played one short, and lost 2-1 to the visitors in worsening conditions of rain and wind. The 2nd. team match v. Haverhill Boys was postponed as too few girls were available.

Junior County Training has continued with sessions each month at Bramford Golf Centre and Bungay Golf Club. New beginners groups have been recruited at both centres and around 60 girls are involved in training, including those who attend Academy sessions.

6 girls were among the group from the Academy who met Pdraig Harrington at Sandwich recently, and Melissa Schroeder played 3 holes with him.

ELGA Trust Training Grant money has been received, but again the Trust is not in a position to consider any applications for funding from individuals. We await news on our bid for 2011 EWGA funding; this year the SGP has taken responsibility for the Women aged 18 - 40 element.

Heidi Baek reached the Cartier U18 semi-final in France; she also won the London Foursome with Alex Peters, and will represent England in the European Girls Championships in Sardinia, and the Girls Home Internationals at Gullane. She was not available for the Suffolk Girls Championship.

Melissa Schroeder played for Rushmere in the Haskell, she won her Section in the Waldringfield Junior Open, and has cut her handicap from 17 to 11 since March!

2. MINUTES of the meeting held on the 10th March, 2011 were accepted as a true record.

3. ACTION FROM LAST MEETING

Testimonial page – the Partnership's website now has testimonials from parents of the Academy children

Volunteers – Bill has still not been able to make contact with Mike McArthy

Golf Day – Alastair and Colin met with Tony Bush and it was agreed that there would not be a Golf Day this year. However, the SGP is keen to support one for 2012 with the help of the Suffolk Foundation.

SGP Calendar of Events – this is still to do.

Colin thanked Tony Garnett for all the excellent publicity he gives to the Partnership.

4. REPORTS

a) Treasurer – Figures to the 31st March 2011 have been circulated showing the total funds available of £20, 594.57. It was stated that our next payment of £9,875.00 should be received around the beginning of June.

b) County Development Officer report – the 16+ projects are up and running:-

- Stonham - has been delayed
- Bramford - starts at the end of May
- Haverhill – has said No
- Rookery Park – has 12 students
- Felixstowe – two full sessions
- Diss – has 10 students
- Ipswich – no reply
- Rushmere are nearly there
- Ufford and Newton Green now preparing for the projects
- Nothing from Gorelston and Bungay

c) Regional Development Officer report – Steve informed the meeting there was nothing to report regarding the merger.

A letter had been sent to all County Union Secretaries asking for an extra £2 to be paid for the EGU Affiliation fee. This money will enable the EGU to make-up any lack of funding and enable them to do a bit more.

GolfMark is now being reassessed, with a view to making it much more business and adult orientated. All CDO's and County Partnerships will be consulted.

d) Golf Foundation report – Katie had circulated her report.

e) Suffolk Sport – Terry asked if the SGP could have a presence at the Youth Games which will be on 10th July at Bury St.Edmunds. Alastair will deal with this.

Terry explained that all Volunteer for the 2012 Games who are not successful will be referred back to Suffolk Sport which may, he hopes, increase the Volunteers in Suffolk.

Changes are now taking place in the schools infrastructure – the Government is funding a three days a week post to organise school games.

5. SUB-COMMITTEE REPORTS

(i) County Academy Programmes – Alastair explained that the three Centres were now up and running with 96 children in total. Alastair is very pleased with the Coaches who are doing excellent work.

Sarah Wilson from Bramford has organised a “Day with Padraig Harrington” and 12 children have been chosen to go. One parent has kindly given a donation of £100 towards the costs.

Alastair informed the meeting that the Coach Development plan needs to be looked at.

(ii) Marketing & Communication – Tony felt that our website did not help the “Beginner” as there was no mention on “How do I start playing golf?” Also there was no mention of Golf Ranges. Steve said that this could easily be done.

6. BIENNIAL REVIEW

This has now been submitted and has been looked at. Steven told the meeting the SGP is 6th in the League Table and that we can expect feedback shortly.

7. CDO PERFORMANCE REVIEW

Colin told the committee that he had met with Alastair on the 29th March when they had a long and detailed discussion. Colin said that Alastair had given a very good and strong performance throughout the year and that we should be very grateful to him for all his hard work.

Alastair achieved all 5 targets set and indeed substantially exceeded four of them.

8. SUFFOLK SHOW

Alastair requires 4 Pros for each day of the Suffolk Show (1st and 2nd June) but at present is lacking support for three sessions. We have 4 slots of 45 minutes each in the Main Marquee and Kevin will perform his Trick Show.

9. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

“Here Come the Girls” – Alastair explained how the project worked – the sessions started in February and 50 ladies attended. There were given free coaching and free use of the Par 3 course, as well as being able to borrow clubs if they wished to practice. The Ladies were closely monitored and they were asked to keep a detailed Journal. The results of these Journals are now coming in.

The project has been extremely successful and there are now two more courses due to start – one smaller one which has been funded by the SLCGA and the other larger one with 50 Ladies.

Alastair said that the age group of the ladies is slightly younger than the first group.

Photos – Tony Dobson has asked all committee members to let him have any photos they may have as we need a pool of photos for marketing purposes.

Funding Request has been received from Halesworth as they wish to attend the Hedingham Hall County Fair. After some discussion it was agreed that if Halesworth agree to run a special Coaching session the Partnership will make a small contribution towards leaflets.
