## **4 REPORTS & ACCOUNTS FOR 2011/2012**

### **PRESIDENT:**

The Reports were sent to all Clubs together with the Agenda and I hope you all have had the opportunity to read them.

These Reports will be taken together and, with your agreement, adopted en bloc.

Resumes of Reports were then given by the GB Members.

### **Report 4(a) County Captain's Report - Mrs Sheila Jarvis**

2012 was a very busy but also a very exciting year. Our championship took place at Ipswich Golf Club and produced some excellent golf, with some of the matchplay games going the full distance of 18 holes to produce a winner. If you weren't there, they really were all worth watching.

It was the turn of Suffolk to host County Week and following months of preparation, we returned to Ipswich Golf Club for the big event. The team representing Suffolk really played some excellent golf all week and came so close to reaching the finals, being only half a point behind Essex who were the eventual winners. Essex then went on to win the final which shows how close we came. Thank you so much to all the players for their supreme effort. (The full details of each match can be seen in the report sent out to each club.)

We were pleased to introduce a couple of new competitions for senior ladies this year. The first one being a championship and the second, a shield for a senior knock-out for a team of 8 players playing hambro scoring. This has proved very popular and hopefully will grow over the years.

We have quite a few competitions throughout the year and I would like to congratulate all the ladies who were successful this year, and if it wasn't your year, well better luck next time.

After only losing one of our county matches we were disappointed to only win 2 of our 8 singles matches at Finals Day hosted by Norfolk at Eaton Golf Club. Essex won overall and retained the trophy they won at Chelmsford last year.

I have now completed my term as 2nd Team Captain and would like to thank all the players who played for the 2nd team and represented their county so well. I wish them all the best in the future. I would also like to thank the clubs that hosted our matches and looked after us so well.

**Report 4(c) Junior Report – Mrs Judy Hamshere**

As I am sure you have already read the Junior Girls report, I will not repeat any of the amazing achievements that our girls had last year. As always their enthusiasm, determination and ability makes it very worthwhile being with them; and fun. Their enjoyment of the game is very contagious.

The hard working committee still does not have a chairman and leader (Junior Organiser); so we take it in turns to chair the meetings and go to the various other golfing committees - like the Governing Body and partnership. We are ticking over for the time being - but hopefully someone will come out of the woodwork to take the job on.

Kay Anderson wrote the main junior report - having compiled the previous three she seemed the best one for the job!!! We have two new ladies joining us but we still need more help - please consider joining us on the committee.

It seems obvious to say that the girls are the future of our golf clubs.  
I wish them all a very good golfing year.

**President:**

The Juniors continue to flourish and go from strength to strength under the guidance of a very dedicated Junior Committee. We felt very proud of the Juniors who played at South Herts in August in the Junior County Match Week. The standard of their golf was wonderful and their etiquette both on and off the course was a credit to them. Thank you Judy for your report and to the Committee and helpers for all their time and enthusiasm given to the Juniors.

**Report 4(d) Senior Report - Mrs Liz Robinson**

The Seniors played six matches with eight players in every team. All were four-ball matches, except the Suffolk Vets match which was foursomes.

The first, in April against the county senior men at Rushmere, was played off full handicap with one courtesy shot. Unfortunately I chose Hambro scoring and we lost by just two holes. Had it been ordinary match-play the ladies would have recorded their first victory in the fixture's six year history.

All county matches are played off scratch. In May we played the Norfolk Vets at Thorpeness. I was able to field another strong team and was disappointed when Norfolk beat us 3 – 1. It was our first home defeat against them since the first fixture in 2001. The next three county matches against Essex Seniors at Channels Golf Club in May, Bedfordshire Seniors at Aspley Guise in June and Cambs & Hunts Seniors at Bury in August were all halved.

In September, as we have done for the last ten years, we played the Suffolk Vets at Aldeburgh. This year handicaps were taken into account but I was delighted that the Seniors won 3–1.

All matches were very enjoyable, keenly contested, played to a high standard and we were very lucky with the weather. My thanks to the clubs for allowing us to play on their superb courses and to their ladies' captains who were there to 'meet and greet' both teams. All much appreciated.

Thirty four seniors offered themselves for selection for one or more matches, handicaps ranging from 5 to 14 and by the last match 26 players from ten different clubs had played. The opposition is far from weak and it's quite difficult to achieve the balance of fielding a good team while wanting to be fair to those available to play. My apologies to anyone who was disappointed and my thanks to all those who played.

I was also involved in the running of the inaugural **Seniors' Ladies Championship** which was played in tandem with the main county championship at Ipswich in May. There were just twelve entries for the 18 hole stroke-play. Scoring was good and after a sudden death

play-off Anne Archer of Ipswich defeated Chris Jamieson of Bungay to win the Stroke Play Trophy. Eight qualified for the match-play stage with two rounds on Saturday and the final on Sunday morning. Most matches were very close and the final was contested between Chris Jamieson and Barbara Cole of Bury, Barbara winning by three and two to become Suffolk's first Senior Ladies' Champion. Hopefully next year this event will attract more competitors.

Another welcome addition to the fixture list was the **Senior Shield**, a four-match four-ball inter-club competition for the over 60's with Hambro scoring and a handicap limit of 24. Seventeen teams entered competition and all rounds until the final were played on a home and away basis. Felixstowe, Gorleston, Stowmarket and Fynn Valley progressed to the semi finals with Felixstowe and Stowmarket going through to the final which was played at Bungay. Felixstowe won by 7 holes. My thanks to Bungay for hosting this final and to Jan Hammett, ladies' captain, whose help was invaluable.

The competition and its format seemed universally popular, played in an excellent spirit and has attracted three new entries for 2013.

**President:**

Despite having knee surgery earlier in the year, Liz you tackled your various duties for the Seniors with efficiency – and you are to be complimented on running the first Seniors Stroke and Match Play which was much enjoyed.

**Report 4(e) England Golf Report - Mrs Anne Archer**

EWGA is no longer in existence with the Birmingham Office having closed in September 2012. Only one front line member of staff transferred to England Golf, so this coming year will be a learning curve for us all. Whilst not unexpected, there have been initial teething problems, everybody involved is working hard to overcome any issues as quickly as possible.

Entries Forms for Regional Competitions should be available on the England Golf Website & efforts will be made to ensure they are on the county website as well. Please check these websites periodically.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind all Ladies that the continued success of their sport can best be ensured by their involvement, starting at club level, as equality at this stage cannot be assumed.

**President:-**

Anne continues to Chair our Delegate Meetings which is much appreciated and keeps us informed of the various "goings on" at Woodhall Spa re The Merger!! Thank you Anne.

#### **Report 4(f) Treasurer's Report – Miss Hermione Scrope**

The Treasurer explained that the net surplus has reduced. Income was roughly the same. There were 127 new members so affiliation fees were up but the monies received from the sale of County Cards had diminished.

Fees received for the knock out competitions had increased due to the new senior competitions: the surplus after other competitions was down due to increased prices.

Expenditure had increased slightly this year mainly due to the County hosting County Although monies were received from EWGA, it did not cover all the expenses. New uniforms were also purchased and the Association made a contribution to the local Golf Partnership.

The Treasurer said she would be happy to answer any questions on the Accounts, but none were raised.

#### **President:-**

We are very fortunate to have Hermione as our Treasurer – we feel our books are in a very safe pair of hands!! We also value your wise counsel from time to time on various issues – thank you Hermione.

#### **Report 4(g) Suffolk Golf Partnership Report – Mrs Wendy Wootton**

The Partnership has now been in existence for just over four years and effectively operating for three years following the appointment of our County Development Officer, Alastair Spink. We can be very proud of our achievements which would not have been possible without our highly regarded CDO and the support we have received from our RDO, Steven Peet and a fully committed Development Team.

We have 16 accredited clubs for GolfMark and one RangeMark facility.

The County Academy Programme has been an enormous success with around 300 youngsters drawn from golf clubs, schools and community and youth centres being involved. A full programme of workshops is ongoing for our coaches including such topics as Biomechanics, 3D & Trackman analysis, fitness and physical screening.

We attended the Suffolk Show and were well supported by our local Professionals and by Kevin Carpenter and his KCGolfShow.

During the year we completed the Active Wellbeing projects funded by Suffolk Sport with nearly 300 new golfers introduced to the game. We also funded a similar initiative branded as 'Golf4All and almost 200 adults participated in those projects. From this success we have been able to recruit Bev Waspe as our 16+ coordinator until March 2013.

We are now working hard on our Development Plan which will run from 2013/2017 and which will be presented to England Golf in December.

So, it's been another busy but successful year and we have continued to make a real difference to our sport in Suffolk.

There were no questions raised on the report.

**President:-**

Another busy year for the Golf Partnership – thank you Wendy for the amount of time you put in helping to bring golf to the fore, especially to the youngsters.

The Reports were then proposed for adoption by **Alicia Cook** of Felixstowe Ferry Golf Club and seconded by **Pauline Hawes** of Flempton Golf Club. There were carried unanimously.

## 5 RESOLUTIONS

**PRESIDENT:**

I hope you have all had the opportunity to read the Resolutions which, as I am sure you will realise, are little more than an exercise to update and tidy the wording of the SLCGA Constitution. However, it is a legal necessity that, in order to change the wording of our Constitution, we need to obtain a two-thirds majority vote in favour of each of these Resolutions. For a Resolution to be passed, at least 25% of you must vote. So, please can I ask you to bear with us and we will proceed through these Resolutions as quickly as possible.

All the Resolutions have been proposed by Anne Archer and seconded by Laura Lowe.

Anne read each of the eight Resolutions below, all of which were voted on individually.

**Resolution 1 – All Sections within the Rules**

It is proposed that the Rules be amended as follows:

The acronym “EWGA” should be replaced with the words “England Golf” throughout the Rules.

**Resolution 2 – Rules 1.6 and 3.8 – Register of Members**

It is proposed to delete Rules 1.6 and 3.8 – Register of Members

For information, Rule 1.6 states that the Honorary Secretary shall keep a register of all members. Rule 3.8 states that the Honorary Secretary shall make the Register of Members available at the General Meeting.

**Resolution 3 – Rule 2 – Subscriptions**

It is proposed that the Rule be amended as follows:

The date “1<sup>st</sup> February” should be replaced with the date “1<sup>st</sup> January”.

**Resolution 4 – Rule 5.1 – The Governing Body – Composition and Rule 6.5 – Election to Governing Body – Other Officers**

It is proposed that the Rules be amended as follows:

The Competition and Match Venue Organiser (3 year tenure) should be added to the list of Officers

**Resolution 5 – Rule 5.4 – Club Delegates**

It is proposed that the wording of this Rule be redrafted to read:

“Each Club shall have the right to nominate a delegate to attend a Club Delegates meeting, of which there shall be up to 4 per calendar year.”

**Resolution 6 – Rules 6.6.1 and 6.6.3 – Election to Governing Body – Competition**

**Organisers – Designation of Areas and Form of Nominations**

It is proposed that the Rules be combined and redrafted, becoming Rule 6.6.1, as follows:

“Each Club shall be expected, in a rotation decided by the Governing Body, to provide a member to serve on the Governing Body and, during her term of office, that member shall serve as an Organiser of an inter-club competition.”

**Resolution 7 – Rule 6.6.2 – Election to Governing Body – Election of Competition**

**Organisers**

It is proposed that the Rule be amended as follows:

The word “twenty four” should be removed and replaced with the word “twelve”

**Resolution 8 – Rule 6.6.4 – Election to Governing Body – Unavailability of Nominated Member**

It is proposed that the Rule be amended as follows:

To delete the words “... or for any reason being unable to attend meeting of the Governing Body ...”

**All the Resolutions were carried.**

**PRESIDENT:**

Thank you Anne, everyone. The Governing Body will incorporate the changes agreed today into the SLCGA Constitution and issue a copy to each Club in due course. The Constitution will also be available under “Association” on the SLCGA Website.

### **Report 4(c) – Junior Report**

2012 has seen us break new ground with a Junior County Match Week, but also operate without a County Junior Organiser.

Competitions have been run on the established pattern, and have been well supported. The Championship was held on a very stormy day at Stowmarket GC, when the Moss Blundell Trophy and Daily Telegraph Qualifier were won by Lily Kent (Ipswich). Emily Rothwell (Woodbridge) won the Handicap Plate; Lily and Alice Barlow (Newton Green) later represented Suffolk in the Champion of Champions tournament. Francesca Tindall (Stowmarket) won the Holly Cup for the Stableford. Alice Barlow won the Matchplay Championship, contested between the top 8 qualifiers from the Strokeplay event. She defeated Lottie Whyman (Ipswich) in a closely fought final at Waldringfield GC.

The High Handicap Championship, held again at St. Audry's GC, was won by Megan Bailey (Bungay). The Lady/Junior Foursomes for the SVLGA trophies were played at Seckford GC in torrential rain, the winners being Amanda and Holly Davies (both Stowmarket). The Autumn meeting was again played at Ipswich GC, and the trophy winner was Lily Kent (Ipswich). The Stableford competition was won by Holly Davies.

The Easter Texas Scramble played over the 9 hole course at Orwell Park School again proved an excellent introduction to competition golf for 20 of our younger girls.

The Girls' 1st team had lost their two lowest handicap players who had moved into the Ladies' ranks, and lost the first practice match against Ipswich GC juniors, but then drew with the Ladies' 2nd team. The Suffolk squad for the first East County Junior Match Week, held at South Herts. GC from August 20 - 22, was Emily Rothwell (Capt.), Sarah Jane Barker (Bungay), Alice Barlow, Amy Bray (Ipswich), Lily Kent, Abbie Symonds (Ipswich), Eleanor Tindall (Stowmarket), and Lottie Whyman. This was the girls' first experience of playing all their matches together and staying away as a team, and they responded in impressive fashion, winning four matches out of five, coming second overall, and losing only to the winners, Hertfordshire. Every member of the squad contributed points to the team total, and the girls clearly enjoyed the format. The East Region Captains and Vice Captains have agreed unanimously to continue with JCMW with Norfolk as hosts for 2013. Our participation was

made possible due to the willingness of Sheila Laws, Sue Cook and Michelle Wilce to accompany the girls, and to a grant towards costs from the Governing Body.

The intention was for the 2nd. team to continue matches against three counties, and after a practice match v. Haverhill juniors, they drew at home\* to Cambs.& Hunts., but lost Away to a stronger Norfolk team. The match v. Bedfordshire was cancelled due to very poor weather, and proved impossible to rearrange. Pam Ratford and Sarah Wilson looked after the matches for the girls.

Six girls played in the Ladies' County Championship at Ipswich GC, where Alice Barlow won the handicap prize in the Strokeplay; she and Lily Kent qualified for the Matchplay. Lily Kent played in County Week at Ipswich GC, while Emily Rothwell, Abbie Symonds and Lottie Whyman have played in 2nd. team and practice matches. Several girls have again played in inter-club competitions, and Lily Kent, Lottie Whyman, Eloise Aldous and Alice Barlow were members of teams in the Weston finals.

4 girls played in the English Girls Championships, Alice Barlow (Newton Green) had a round of 73 in the U15 competition; Lily Kent and Lottie Whyman came 9th. and 10th. respectively in the Abraham Trophy for the most improved girls in England.

7 girls played in the East Junior Championships at Royal Norwich GC, when Lottie Whyman won the scratch prize, and Lottie, Lily Kent and Alice Barlow won the team prize for Suffolk.

Around 45 girls began training at Bramford and Bungay, and the number has grown over the summer as more have joined the Beginners' group. Sarah Wilson and Andrew Collison direct the sessions, assisted by members of the Junior Committee, and by Sue Strutt- Holmes and Mary Wilderspin at Bungay. We are very grateful to the coaches and to all the ladies who give their time to ensure that the sessions are enjoyable and profitable for the girls involved.

Each year some girls from the Beginners groups move on to the Suffolk Academy, and this year a further 26 girls have been involved in the Suffolk Academy programme.

Eloise Aldous and Alice Barlow (both Newton Green) continue with EWGA Birdie squad training, and Lily Kent is in the 2nd. year of the Advanced Apprenticeship in Sporting Excellence course which is part of England Futures programme.

Lily Kent, Lottie Whyman, Melissa Schroeder (Rushmere) and Abbie Symonds were invited to Suffolk ladies' training.

The Handicap Challenge continues to highlight girls who have achieved the greatest reductions during the year, although playing conditions have been less conducive to big reductions this year. 3 girls have come down by at least 30%, 6 girls have gained CONGU handicaps, and 3 have gained junior handicaps. A total of 20 girls have reduced their handicaps.

We are ever grateful to SVLGA for their support, their donation this year have funded the High Handicap competition and the Starter packs for new girls, as well as contributing to the cost of training. We are also grateful to the donor of a Silver Quaich trophy, which will be awarded to the high handicap girl making the greatest progress each year, and to the individuals who have donated prizes as these are always most welcome! Thanks are due too

to the golf clubs which allow us to hold events and matches, and to the Ladies' captains, members and other supporters who help ensure that all runs smoothly.

We have been fortunate in having County Captain Sheila and County President Pippa working with us this year, and contributing to many of our events. Their support has been particularly valuable as, without a CJO, individual Committee members have had to take on extra duties. It is due to their combined efforts that the programme has run without detriment to the girls involved. Sheila Laws is stepping down from the Committee at this point, after serving for nine years on the Junior Committee, and we thank her for this outstanding commitment, and for steering the 1st. team so successfully. Amanda Davies has also stepped down due to work commitments, so we hope to recruit new members as well as a CJO.

Our Junior Captain, Emily Rothwell, has been a very reliable leader and responded admirably to her new role at JCMW. We thank her for her contribution and wish her continued success as she moves out of junior golf. The Junior Captain for 2013 will be Eleanor Tindall who has progressed through the Suffolk girls' ranks from the Beginners group to 2nd. team, and now the 1st. team. We are confident that her calm and capable approach will be an asset in leading the girls in 2013, and we wish her every success.

#### **Report 4(d) – Senior Organiser's Report**

My end of year report, like Gaul, is divided into three parts.

Firstly I enjoyed captaining the **Senior Team**, unfortunately in a non-playing capacity following my knee replacement. There were six matches and eight players in every team. All were four-ball matches except the Suffolk Ladies' Vets Association match which was foursomes.

The first, in April against the county senior men at Rushmere, was played off full handicap with one courtesy shot. Unfortunately I chose Hambro scoring and we lost by just two holes. Had it been ordinary match-play the ladies would have recorded their first victory in the fixture's six year history.

In May we played the Norfolk Vets at Thorpeness. I was able to field another strong team and was disappointed when Norfolk beat us. It was our first home defeat against Norfolk since the first fixture in 2001. The next three county matches against Essex Seniors at Channels Golf Club in May, Bedfordshire Seniors at Aspley Guise in June and Cambs & Hunts Seniors at Bury in August were all halved.

In September, as we have done for the last ten years, we played the Suffolk Vets at Aldeburgh. This year handicaps were taken into account but I was delighted that the Seniors won, although three of the opposition and one of the Seniors had 'dual nationality'.

For all the matches we were extremely lucky with the weather. Matches were very enjoyable, keenly contested, played to a high standard and in a very friendly spirit. My thanks to the clubs for allowing us to play on their superb courses and to their ladies' captains who were there to 'meet and greet' both teams. All much appreciated.

Thirty four seniors offered themselves for selection for one or more matches, handicaps ranging from 5 to 14. I was able to offer at least one match place to all but two and five others were selected but subsequently cancelled. Therefore twenty six players from ten different clubs were involved.. The opposition is far from weak and it's quite difficult to achieve the balance of fielding a good team while wanting to be fair to those available to play. My apologies to anyone who was disappointed and my thanks to all those who played.

My second responsibility was to oversee the running of the inaugural **Seniors' Ladies Championship** which was played in tandem with the main county championship at Ipswich in May. There were just twelve entries for the 18 hole stroke-play. Scoring was good and after a sudden death play-off Ann Archer of Ipswich defeated Chris Jamieson of Bungay to win the Stroke Play Trophy. Eight qualified for the match-play stage with two rounds on Saturday and the final on Sunday morning. Most matches were very close (two went to the eighteenth and two down the nineteenth) and the final was contested between Chris Jamieson and Barbara Cole of Bury. Barbara won by three and two to become Suffolk's first Senior Ladies' Champion. Hopefully next year this event will attract more competitors.

Another welcome addition to the fixture list was the **Senior Shield**, a four-match four-ball inter-club competition for the over 60's with Hambro scoring and a handicap limit of 24. Seventeen teams entered. Brett Vale and Felixstowe played in the preliminary round and this, and the subsequent three rounds up to and including the semi-finals, were all played on a home and away basis. Unfortunately St Audry's had to withdraw from the competition. Of the fifteen matches played there were three away wins and twelve home wins. Felixstowe, Gorleston, Stowmarket and Fynn Valley progressed to the semi finals with Felixstowe (+5) and Stowmarket (+14) going through to the final which was played at Bungay. My thanks to Bungay for hosting this final and to Jan Hammett, ladies' captain, whose help was invaluable. The course was in excellent condition, the weather fine and Felixstowe came out the winners by seven holes.

The competition and its format seems to have been universally popular, played in an excellent spirit and has attracted three new entries for 2013.

My thanks to Jeanette Longman, county secretary, for all her help during the year, to Sheila Jarvis, county captain, for all her help, to Julie Latimer-Jones for the website coverage and special thanks to Pippa Beak, county president, for officiating and helping at the Senior Championship Final and the Suffolk Shield Final.

## **Report 4(e) – England Golf Report**

### National

This past year has seen probably the biggest change in how our sport is directed and funded since it began. We are now a unified national body under the name of 'England Golf', all run from Woodhall Spa. EWGA like its predecessor ELGA no longer exists and the offices in Birmingham closed in September. We are experiencing enormous changes and patience is required when dealing with many of the issues that inevitably arise. I would urge you all to look at the website, which is full of very useful information and will be vital if you wish to

enter national competitions. Although the venue at Woodhall is not easy to travel to it is very interesting to view and to participate in the changes that are taking place. To have a Board Member Judi Walker as a member of our County is not only very useful but also a privilege.

### Regional

The Eastern Region continues to organise the main competitions throughout the year. These began with the Medal Finals played at John O’Gaunt and 2 Suffolk players qualified to play in the National Final. The Foursomes at The Links, Newmarket was won by Amanda Norman and Sharon Luckman with other Suffolk players also in the frame. Regional and Junior Championships also resulted in Suffolk successes. We host the Regional Senior’s competition at Haverhill and this is an opportunity to thank them for their continued support, the date for 2013 being Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> July. Finally and very definitely not least the County Week at Ipswich Golf Club was unanimously declared a great success with Suffolk narrowly defeated by a little half point from going forward to the national finals, which, I am happy to report, was won by our own regional winners Essex. I would like to thank all who ably assisted in whatever capacity, in all these events. Next year we will host the Junior Championship at Stowmarket on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> August.

### Local

Without doubt one of the best parts of the job is to meet up with old friends and hopefully to make new ones. This year primarily due to the input of the delegates on your behalf the County has listened to suggestions for change. The major changes are the new formats for the Weston and Cranworth Competitions. These meetings are a way for the club player, via her delegate, to voice her concerns or make helpful suggestions. Points raised are passed to the relevant person for consideration and or comment. However, it should be emphasised that these meetings are a forum and decisions taken are not binding.

### **Report 4(g) – Suffolk Golf Partnership Report**

The Partnership has now been in existence for just over four years and effectively operating for three years following the appointment of our County Development Officer, Alastair Spink. We can be very proud of our achievements which would not have been possible without our highly regarded CDO and the support we have received from our RDO, Steven Peet and a fully committed Development Team.

We have continued to make progress with GolfMark with 16 accredited clubs and one RangeMark facility. 12 of those clubs have been awarded ‘High Achiever’ status which is a fantastic result. 20 clubs are registered for the National Skills Challenge and 12 have applied for a Club Coaching Grant so far this year.

The County Academy Programme has been an enormous success with around 300 youngsters drawn from golf clubs, schools and community and youth centres being involved. The first CAP Championship was held at Seckford GC in September with 60 young people taking part and we were successful in obtaining additional grant monies which is being used to fund competitive experiences including an Order of Merit event. A full programme of workshops

is ongoing for our coaches including such topics as Biomechanics, 3D & Trackman analysis, fitness and physical screening.

With generous support from Suffolk Sport we were again able to attend the Suffolk Show and 'pitch our net' within the Sports Village. We were well supported by our local Professionals and by Kevin Carpenter and his KCGolfShow.

Ransomes Jacobsen continued their sponsorship of our Junior Golf Awards and the Junior Academy Awards which were presented along with the Partnership Volunteer Awards at a successful conference held at the David Lloyd Leisure Club on 8<sup>th</sup> November.

During the year we completed the Active Wellbeing projects funded by Suffolk Sport with nearly 300 new golfers introduced to the game. We also funded a similar initiative branded as 'Golf4All and almost 200 adults participated in those projects. Our successes in this area helped us gain additional funding of £30k to be used for adult recruitment and we have been able to recruit Bev Waspe as our 16+ coordinator until March 2013.

We are now working hard on our Development Plan which will run from 2013/2017 and which will be presented to England Golf in December.

So, it's been another busy but successful year and we have continued to make a real difference to our sport in Suffolk
