Amanda Norman read a special tribute for Julie Latimer Jones (Aldeburgh).

Julie began her golfing career in her teenage years in Mansfield, Nottinghamshire. In the late 1950's, she joined to South Herts GC, where she had lessons with Dai Rees. Whilst there, in 1972, she played for the winning South Herts team in the Pearson Trophy, a county and inter county trophy for Herts, Middlesex, Kent and Surrey. Bill, her husband, was a member of South Herts when Julie joined, so it would seem probable that they may have met there.

When Julie moved to Suffolk, she was a member of Stoke-by-Nayland, before moving to Aldeburgh. At Aldeburgh, she represented the club in the Weston and Haskell trophies for many years. She served on the General Committee and was Lady Captain in 1997 and later was made an Honorary Life Member for her service to the club and to golf.

Julie played in the County Team for many years and had a very effective foursomes' partnership with Vivienne Cullen (Sears).

Her service to county golf culminated in the Captaincy in the 1980's and she was President in the 2000's.

One of Julie's greatest contributions to the county was her reporting in the East Anglian Daily Times and, in addition, on the website. During County Match Week, members of the team would be agog to see Julie's reports, and there would be great excitement to see what she had written on each day's play. Her accounts were descriptive, humorous, accurate and kind. Julie also contributed regularly to the Norfolk and Suffolk Golfer, keeping the readers current on the latest happenings in Ladies' golf.

Julie, together with Hermione Scrope and some members of the Governing Body, was instrumental in getting the original county website up and running, and collaborated on the current website. She contributed to it until very recently.

In the 1990's, she succeeded Peggy Carrick of Norfolk as Standard Scratch Advisor for Suffolk and Norfolk, which changed in 2002 to Suffolk Team Leader in the new USGA Rating System for the English Ladies Golf Association, and then England Golf. This she continued with, until the system changed to include the English men, although she was always available in an advisory capacity. This was typical of the person she was. There can't be many people who have contributed more to golf, personally, at club level and at county level.

County Championships 2022

Report 4(b) - Junior Organiser's Report 2022

This has been my first full year since taking over from Alice Barlow. Despite the information left for me it has been a learning curve particularly the computer programme. I would like to say a big thank you to Di Hegarty for her patience in trying to teach me.

I met with the new Junior Captain Juliette Coffey before the Spring meeting to hear from her about future friendlies and to encourage her as Captain to feel she could step up in her role.

The year of Competitions began with the Spring Meeting at Woodbridge Golf Club. The course was looking very good, and all the girls enjoyed the challenge, particularly the second hole which led to several balls rolling off the green into the pond! Despite this Sophie Kubitzek with a medal round of 74 NET 70 was the winner. Talia Brewer won the net with 75.

Due to Covid restrictions the award for player of the year was presented to Sophie Kubitzek and the most improved player Jasmine Potter at the Spring Meeting in Woodbridge.

This year the Junior Championship was held jointly with the boys at Halesworth. This was the first time a joint event had been held. Everyone felt it went well and should continue to be joint in 2023. The winner was Juliette Coffey 161 medal score, best net score Melissa Coffey.

The Stapleford competition was won by Abigail Hope with 43 points.

Natasha Gregory was awarded a certificate for a hole in one.

We arrived at County Week on August 1st at Bar Hill. My first experience and attending on my own was a little daunting. However the organisers Beds and Bucks were so supportive and friendly they made it much easier for me.

The girls played very well but sadly we did not have the strongest team, this led to them battling to win their games. I was very impressed with their attitude and their commitment

to the team. Juliette had provided each team member with a goody bag on arrival, and this was a great moral booster. She led the team well as their Junior Captain. Those parents who attended I thank them for their support and a particular thankyou to Ken Coffey for his help.

I was very proud following County Week to be given positive feedback from other teams which highlighted the friendly and engaging manner the girls showed in each game they played.

I enjoyed attending County Week, being with the girls, feeling it helped me to become more familiar with them and hopefully for them to get to know me.

I would like to say thankyou for the gift of flowers and the card. It was a lovely surprise, and I was very touched by the words expressed in the card.

The Autumn meeting was held at Fynn Valley it was a little disappointing that the numbers entries attending was low. Despite this it was a positive game with Sophie Kubitzek winning with a medal round of 82 and Josie Knights winning the net score of 76.

The following day we played Junior/Lady foursomes. Once again, the turnout was low, and I hope we can encourage more entries for next year. I have made the decision not to hold the Autumn meeting and the Foursomes on the same weekend hoping this will support more attendance.

The foursomes were won by Imogen Potter and her Partner Diane Leeder with 36 points. I would like to thank Di Hegarty for playing nine holes with Jessica one of the young girls who has been coming to the development group. It was a positive experience for her and for Georgie another youngster who was not eligible to enter but enjoyed the experience of playing.

There have been several friendlies played and I would like to thank Aldeburgh, Felixstowe, Thetford, Bungay and Ipswich. Friendly against Norfolk girls at Thetford.

The feedback from the friendlies played was once again very positive in respect of the friendly way the girls played and engaged.

We played in the Eastern Region Team event at Thetford. This is mixed handicap event and Juliette led as Captain, Josie Knights and four of the girls who have been attending the development group through the summer. They all enjoyed the experience and loved playing for Suffolk. We are organising the event next year on the 17th September at Hintlesham Golf Club. The venue chosen for the easy access for the teams.

Training has been ongoing at Felixstowe and I thank Andrew and Rob for their ongoing support and guidance to the girls. It has at times been disappointing regarding attendance and I would like to encourage all first and second team girls to put dates in their diary and take advantage of the training. It is also important as attendance enables the team to become more co-essive. To support the girls working as a team I would like to request that parents are not in attendance.

We had four develop training days with eight girls. This was held at Woodbridge. I thank Calvin Sherwood for his input and training. The girls who attended have all gained from the time and being able to play several holes on the forest course which made the day more interesting. Four of the girls Chloe, Izzy, Abigail and Shannon have all improved their handicaps over the summer and have been asked to join Suffolk girls second team. We were very grateful this to receive a donation from MSC Via David Woolnough. This enabled each girl to receive a team shirt and long sleeved mid layer top. Plans for 2023.

The future is looking brighter for girls and golf. I have been working with the Junior boys' team members over the summer.

Trevor Mason Chair of Suffolk Junior boys and I have been in contact and had meetings. I was invited to attend a meeting with the all the members of the boy's junior team committee on the 31 October 2022. This was to discuss a new document which has now been approved by Suffolk Golf Union to build a system. A development pathway for girls

and boys. In working together we are looking to provide three 'coaching hubs' in the County where boys and girls will be invited. These will be for training and development and a pathway for each Junior will be put in place. There are several professionals who have put themselves forward to work within the three hubs.

There is also a proposal to arrange a new competition 'nines' which will be a follow on from golf sixes. This will be arranging nine-hole matches between clubs using different formats. I have been involved in the planning and this will be available for boys and girls with several of the competitions being qualifiers. This will support juniors obtaining a handicap. This format also has the support of Suffolk Golf Union. I am attending a meeting on the 16th November at Seckford when a number of golf clubs are going to be present to hear about this plan and sign up to the format.

Funding has been agreed by the Suffolk Junior Boys and we will need to consider the funding from Suffolk Junior Girls.

I would like to thank Juliette Coffey for being Captain sadly her last year with the Juniors as she has reached 18. I know from speaking with her she has a lot to look forward to going onto university here or in America to study engineering. She has been a valuable member of the team and her input and team membership will be missed.

I would also like to thank the parents for their time and commitment to driving their girls to the many venues this year. Without this support from parents we would not have the team of juniors who have played so well this year.

I am hopeful I am now at a stage where I am beginning to understand and make plans. I will still need Di Hegarty as computer knowledge is still sadly lacking. I look forward to the next year and the exciting changes being made to promote Junior Golf. Working with the Junior Boys' team will ensure that we encourage more growth in junior golf.

Originally planned for March 2020 then March 2021, we were at last able to have our preseason get-together at Ipswich golf Club in March this year - third time lucky! 36 ladies attended and, after sandwiches and a catch-up, we headed out on to the course for an 18 hole 4BBB fun competition. As with all the Seniors matches and events, photos and results are on the Suffolk website. Many thanks to Ipswich golf Club for hosting us, the course was playing very well and the sandwiches and cake were delicious!

What a relief it was to have a more or less normal season. All our matches were played as planned apart from with the Suffolk Junior Girls where we had to cancel the match due to the difficulty in finding a suitable date - hopefully we will be able to rectify that next year.

East Region Senior Women's League

The inaugural year of this league went ahead as planned with Essex, Hertfordshire, Norfolk and Suffolk initially taking part and Cambs & Hunts subsequently joined as well. The format for these matches is 6 singles played off scratch though, this year, we still played 4BBB against Cambs & Hunts. Next year Bedfordshire will be joining the league which is excellent news. We are hoping to finalise the rules for the league over the winter months.

We performed well against strong opposition and were very pleased to have come joint second with Essex, Hertfordshire came first. The results were as follows and more detailed accounts can be found on the County website.

Report 4(d) – England Golf Report 2022

In addition to the England Golf AGM and General Meetings at Woodhall Spa "virtual" county update meetings have been held throughout the year.

The number of iGolf subscriptions, the platform which enables independent golfers to benefit from a WHS handicap, is now over 27,200 and 2,000 of those have progressed to full golf club membership.

Suffolk hosted two England Golf East Region competitions this year - the Foursomes Championship at Ipswich GC in April and the Senior Ladies Championship at Hintlesham GC in July. The feedback from those participating was very favourable, and our thanks must go to both clubs for their support and organisation.

This year we "trialled" holding the Delegates Meetings at different locations around the County to make it fairer to those who attend in terms of time and distance travelled. My thanks to Bury St Edmunds, Felixstowe and Halesworth who made us most welcome. The trial has worked well and all Delegates agree that future meetings should continue in this vane.

I should also like to add a special thank you to Sue Cook for all that she does in relation to The 100 Club.

Report 4(e) – Treasurer's Report 2022

Once again, I would like to thank my predecessor Hermione Scrope for her work and support during the transition period. It has, inevitably, been an extremely steep learning curve with some very busy periods. During the year the input of financial information has been migrated from Excel to a more formal system (at no cost). There has also been a significant increase in the use of BACS transfers for both income and payments – it's so much quicker and easier to track.

Income for the year to 31st October 2022 has increased primarily due to the incredibly generous sponsorship received from several sources in the year (£8,000 in total). This will support the activities of the various county teams. Our grateful thanks go to Jo Woodward, MSC UK, Willis Ltd., One Group Construction and Suffolk Ladies Veteran Association. The headline figure is that for the year to 31st October 2022 an overall loss has been incurred (£2568). This can be accounted for by:

 Many clubs have found it necessary to review their charging structure for both the use of facilities and catering. We have, therefore, seen a substantial increase in the

- charges for all competitions. Several competitions have had a disappointingly low number of entrants and I would urge all clubs to promote the county competitions (including the Divisions) as widely as possible amongst their members.
- There has been an increase in county competitions and matches in the year and in addition to the first team there is now a 2nd team as well as junior and seniors' teams. Whilst this has been welcomed, the inevitable consequence is that expenditure has increased; considerable investment having been made in training and the purchase of kit.
- 2022 has also seen the further development and enhancement of the website and the purchase of a computer and associated software. In addition, the ancient radios have now been replaced – contact can now be made with referees on the course whilst competitions are underway.

Going forward, the bank reserves are healthy, and we will look to secure sponsorship for the teams if possible. It will also be a year of transition for the Association as we move from being an unincorporated association into a company limited by guarantee. Challenging but exciting times are ahead!

Report 4(g) - 2nd Team Report

County Officials, Ladies of Suffolk,

My name is Charlie Garrod and I'm the Suffolk Ladies 2nd Team Captain. As most of you are aware, this is the first year for nearly 10 years that Suffolk has an active 2nd Team.

I am really pleased to advise that we have had a successful relaunch of the County 2nd Team so far.

There was a positive response to canvassing for players via various media (the county website, emails to clubs, Facebook and other social media, the County Junior and Senior squads, and the good of word of mouth), resulting in over 30 new people coming forward expressing an interest in participating and more still forthcoming.

There is a good spread of players coming from many clubs, all enthusiastic about being given the opportunity to be a part of the new 2nd team and are proud at having the chance to represent Suffolk.

Training sessions with the Felixstowe Ferry Professionals Andrew Robinson and Sam Forgan were run early in the year in conjunction with the Ladies 1st Team sessions (1st team in the mornings, 2nd team in the afternoons). These were really enjoyed and beneficial for the attending players and we will be continuing these again this year. Sponsorship of GBP 3,500 was kindly provided by Willis Towers Watson towards the 2nd Team expenses for 2022 and we will be asking them for their continued support in 2023. If there are any other donations or offers of sponsorship, these are of course most welcome! Team kit (shirts, jumpers, waterproof jackets) have been purchased for the squad, with some players purchasing their own which has helped reduced expenses for the county. The main competitive event for the 2nd team is the East Region 2nd Team County match days, which this year were at the end of August at Colne Valley in Essex. The team competed for the first time since 2013 in the same format as the 1st team (i.e. foursomes and singles each day against the 4 other counties).

It was the first inter-county 2nd team matches for everyone (except me) so it was a new experience for them all. All of them approached it with enthusiasm, determination and commitment, all being flexible and understanding as only 7 of the 10 players play each match. I am very proud of how they conducted themselves and represented Suffolk fantastically, bonded well together, built relationships and fought as a team courageously including caddying for each other. They all were very grateful for the opportunity to represent their county, all enjoying the experience and excited for the future matches. The individual games during the week mostly went to hole 17 or 18 which is a reflection of the great golf played by everyone in the team. We scored on every day even though they were generally out handicapped (often playing very low single figure handicaps, especially Essex who fielded some plus handicaps). Our team put up a good fight even being up in some matches but sadly often these didn't finish in our favour so the county vs county match results were frustrating as there were so many opportunities to win which slipped

away but encouraging for the future.

We are very hopeful that this is just the start of a great team base for this year and future years.

Thank you for all the support and good wishes provided to the team during the match days. Special thanks to Sarah Gotts, Jules Harboard and Vicky Elliston who came to caddy and be part of the team. They were brilliant help and support for the players and hopefully the experience has helped their own games too ready for the future matches. It was lovely to be welcomed back to the Regional 2nd team match days by all of the other counties (Captains/Presidents/other officials). All of them commenting that it's great to have Suffolk back competing and how good the team were together, representing Suffolk with integrity and determination in good competitive spirit.

This year, Suffolk are hosting the Regional County Match days at Bungay on Monday 21st to Weds 23rd August. We hope some of you will be able to support the team please? It's always encouraging to see friendly blue around the course or if you would like to assist on the days as a ball-spotter or hostess or other volunteer in some way, that would be greatly appreciated.

Suffolk have a lot of great players wanting to represent us, with still more coming forward, as well as juniors getting better and better and joining the 2nd Team squad which is great! The County Governing Body continue to work together to develop a coordinated approach to the county squads.

Overall, I'm really proud and pleased with the first year and am positive for the 2nd team's future.

With limited liability in place members are protected and only required to pay an agreed sum if the county becomes insolvent (typically less than £10). In addition, provided the directors have been compliant with company law requirements, having limited liability will protect the directors of the company and members against a claim.

Members are asked to approve special resolution as stated above and begin the registration process as soon as is practicable. It is intended that the name of the company will be Suffolk Ladies County Golf Association Ltd.

At each draw the first prize was £100, and 12 prizes were given in total each time.

This year, the delegates have done an amazing job and we have collected £2645. This

sum is split into £1185 (Gaming Licence included) for County funds and £1460, to be given away in prizes. £365 can be drawn at each of the 4 draws, giving 8 prizes ranging from £100 and then in decreasing order.

I'd like to thank everyone who managed to take part this year thereby supporting the County. We now seem to be proficient at paying electronically.
